CODE OF CONDUCT
CORRECTIVE BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES
(Discipline Policy)

Parents are required to review the following revised Corrective Behavior Guidelines and adhere to the Code of Conduct. Please talk to your child/ren about good behavior while attending school. Certain behavior may cause suspension and/or expulsion from school.

It is important for Quality Time to employ effective behavior management strategies. It is our goal to incorporate multiple techniques to facilitate child guidance and classroom management. In some instances, further disciplinary steps must be taken to rectify behavior problems within the school and to bring these repeated problems to the attention of parents.

In line with QTLC policies and procedures, the following may result in your child's suspension or expulsion from QTLC:

1. Failure to comply to the school's Rules and Regulations:

- A. Incomplete Records and outdated information, e.g., contact information and phone numbers.
- B. All students 3 years and older being tardy for more than 5 minutes, 3 times within a 30 day period.
- C. Health regulations and violations.
- D. Repeatedly reporting to school out of the established uniform for students 3 years and older.
- E. Tuition Contract (failure to uphold financial obligations to the school delinquency in excess of three weeks).
- F. Three (3) or more visits to the office within one week for behavior modification.
- G. All students 3 year and above must have the required text book within two (2) weeks of entering the program.

2. Deliberate destruction of school property and/or destruction of another child's or staff's property.

- 1st Offense – Conference with parent; warning issued.
- 2nd Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for one (1) week with final warning.
- 3rd Offense – Conference with parent; expulsion from school.

In case of destruction of school property, any child's or staff's property, parent may be asked to reimburse the cost/value of the said property.

3. For all 2 year-olds and above, profanity or abusive language directed at the staff and/or another child.

- 1st Offense – Conference with parent; warning issued.
- 2nd Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for two (2) days.
- 3rd Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for four (4) days.
- 4th Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for one (1) week, with final warning issued.
- 5th Offense – Conference with parent; expulsion from school.

4. Intentional attempts to physically harm another child or staff member:

- A. Minor injuries:
 - 1st Offense – Conference with parent; warning issued.
 - 2nd Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for two (2) days.
 - 3rd Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for four (4) days with final warning issued.

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4th Offense – Conference with parent; expulsion from school.

B. Major injuries:

1. Stabbing someone with a knife/scissors/pencils, or any other object.
2. Stabbing someone causing a large wound.
3. Intentionally pushing someone down and or hurting someone, which may cause broken bones.
 - 1st Offense – Conference with parent and suspension for (two) 2 weeks with final warning (Police will be called in).
 - 2nd Offense – Conference with parent and expulsion from school (Authorities will be notified.)

5. Inappropriate body acts:

- A. Hitting – causing injury to other children or staff (see # 4).
- B. Biting (skin broken) two years or older.
 - 1st Offense - Conference with parent; warning issued.
 - 2nd Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for two (2) days.
 - 3rd Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for four (4) days with final warning.
 - 4th Offense – Conference with parent; expulsion from school.
- C. Kicking/Pushing (see # 4 A & B).
- D. Discharges (deliberately spitting, urinating, etc. on another child or staff member).
 - 1st Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for two (2) days.
 - 2nd Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for four (4) days.
 - 3rd Offense – Conference with parent; final warning and suspension for one (1) week.
 - 4th Offense – Conference with parent; expulsion from school.
- E. Exposing private parts of the body.
 - 1st Offense – Conference with parent; warning issued.
 - 2nd Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for two (2) days and final warning.
 - 3rd Offense – Conference with parent; expulsion from school.
- F. Cutting someone's hair or pulling someone's hair exposing the scalp.
 - 1st Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for three (3) days and final warning issued.
 - 2nd Offense – Conference with parent; expulsion from school.

6. Intentionally:

- A. Putting hands on someone else's private body parts.
- B. Putting hands inside someone else's clothes and touching their private body parts.
 - 1st Offense: Conference with parent; suspension for two (2) days and final warning issued.
 - 2nd Offense: Conference with parent; expulsion from school.

7. Bringing in, showing or distributing:

- A. Pornographic pictures, magazines and books.
- B. Pornographically explicit movies, music videos, CDs, tapes, records, cassettes, books and magazines.
 - 1st Offense: Conference with parent; suspension for two (2) days and final warning issued.
 - 2nd Offense: Conference with parent; expulsion from school.

8. **Habitually late in picking up child/ren up from school after 6:00 p.m. (e.g. 3 times in a 30 day period), a late fee of \$5.00/minute will be charged. Suspension and or expulsion may also occur.**

9. **Parent's inappropriate behavior toward staff members and other child/ren (e.g., verbal abuse or threats), immediate action will be taken to be determined by the Director of the school. Conference with parent, suspension and/or expulsion from school.**

10. Any continuous violation/s by the parent/s, including

- A. Not providing updated phone numbers and contact information.
- B. Parking violations.
- C. Not signing your child in/out daily.

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- D. Using abusive language in the building.
 - 1st Offense: Conference with parent; warning issued.
 - 2nd Offense: Conference with parent; suspension for two (2) days.
 - 3rd Offense: Conference with parent; suspension for one (1) week.
 - 4th Offense: Conference with parent; expulsion from the school.

11. Physical punishment of a child within the school boundaries by parents, guardians, grandparents, other relatives and friends.

- A. Hitting your own child/ren or other children in the school building/property.
 - 1st Offense: Conference with parents, suspension for two (2) days and warning issued.
 - 2nd Offense: Conference with parent; child suspended for one (1) week and final warning issued.
 - 3rd Offense: Conference with parents; expulsion from school.
- B. Disciplining someone else's child/ren in the school building/property.
 - 1st Offense: Suspension for three (3) days and the parent/s involved in the incident will not be allowed to enter the school.
 - 2nd Offense: Expulsion from the school.

12. If your child/ren are diagnosed with having a contagious/infectious condition, you must inform the school within 24 hours after the diagnosis has been made. A Doctor's note is required for your child to return to school. QTLC reserves the right to make our own decision about your child attending/not attending school for that particular period of time. Repeat violations will result in suspension or expulsion from school (will be determined by the Director of the school).

13. Writing/distributing/sharing the following:

- A. Threatening letters/materials.
- B. Love letters/materials containing threats.
- C. Hate letter/materials.
- D. Making threatening remarks to staff, classmates and/or other individuals associated with school.
 - 1st Offense – Conference with parent; suspension for one (1) week with final warning.
 - 2nd Offense – Conference with parent; expulsion from school.

14. Parents not escorting their child/ren upon entering the school and upon exiting the school.

- 1st Offense: Conference with parent; warning issued.
- 2nd Offense: Conference with parent; suspension for two (2) days.
- 3rd Offense: Conference with parent; expulsion from school.

15. Children bringing in cell phones, iPhone, pagers, etc. Parent must inform the Administrative Office and child's teacher, and the devices must be labeled and stored at the teacher's desk.

Refusal to do so:

- 1st Offense: Conference with parent; suspension for two (2) days.
- 2nd Offense: Conference with parent; suspension for one (1) week and final warning issued.
- 3rd Offense: Conference with parent; expulsion from school.

16. Your children are not allowed to bring the following items under any circumstances at any time:

- Drugs of any kind, including cocaine, marijuana, narcotics, prescription drugs or over-the-counter drugs brought in by a child.
- Wine, liquor, beer or any kind of alcoholic beverage.
- Mace
- Any glass items/bottles/containers, etc.
- Nails and screws of any type
- Explosive device(s) and/or any harmful chemicals

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- Any kind of food laced with chemicals and/or other toxic substances which can harm other people
- Large size stones
- Guns/pistols of any kind (toys included)
- Hammers (no toy hammers)
- Large size scissors (no toy scissors)
- Knives (machetes, swords, etc.), including toys
- Matches
- Heavy metal chains/objects/rods//belts that may cause injury or harm to others
- Any heavy object that can be used as a weapon
- Screw drivers and long-pointed sharp objects/toys included
- Arrows/bows/sharp hooks, including toys
- Saw of any kind or cutting tools, including toys
- Cigarettes, nicotine, cigars or any kind of tobacco products
- Lighters or any flammable fluid
- No toy of any kind that can be used as a weapon or is harmful to others
 - 1st offense – Conference with parent; final warning issued and one (1) week suspension. Police and appropriate authorities will also be notified.
 - 2nd offense – expulsion and police and/or other authorities will also be notified.

In addition to these are guidelines, it may be necessary, depending upon the circumstances and severity of the incident or injury, to bypass all of the above-mentioned policy statements and take more immediate serious or severe actions. There may be offenses which are not covered in these guidelines, and we reserve the right to take immediate necessary actions. _____
